Free Movement of Persons

Introduction

The Armenian legislation in the field of free movement of persons does not comply with the requirements of the EU legislation.

The EU legislation in this field establishes common legal basis for the recognition of qualifications as well as peculiarities of the recognition of qualifications related to separate professions (pharmacist, veterinary surgeons and etc). This chapter regulates also the legal status of persons working in other countries.

On 11 April 1997, the Republic of Armenia has ratified the Lisbon Convention¹ on the Recognition of Qualifications Concerning Higher Education in the European Region. However, the main legal acts of this field, i.e. the RoA laws on Education² and on Higher and Post-graduate Professional Education³, do not regulate the procedures for recognition of qualifications concerning higher-education, professional education and training. The sole legislative provision related to the regulation of the legal relations of this field is the Article 4 of the RoA Law on Higher and Post-graduate Professional Education, according to which the recognition of diplomas and comparison of qualification degrees of higher and post-graduate education of Armenia in European and other foreign countries is envisaged among the policy principles of higher and post-graduate professional education.

The Armenian legislation does not provide for the legal regulation of issues related to the free movement of doctors, pharmacists, lawyers, architects, veterinary surgeons, as well as the establishment of legal entities and provision of service by the above mentioned persons.

Apart from this, the Armenian legislation also does not envisage the regulation of issues related to the free movement of workers and their family members, as well as their residence in the territory of the country after having been employed.

Within the framework of the National Programme, it is envisaged to ensure the partial compliance of the Chapter on "Free Movement of Persons" with the requirements of the EU legislation by 2009.

The issue of approximation with the Council Directives⁴ No. 94/80 of 6 December 1994 and No. 93/109 of 6 December 1993 shall be considered after 2008.

The Council Decision No. 85/368/EEC of 16 July 1985 on the comparability of vocational training qualifications between the Member States of the European Community is not subject to approximation under the National Programme, since it is not applicable in the Republic of Armenia.

For the regulation of issues relating to the free movement of foreign workers, the Council Regulation No. 1612/68 of 15 October 1968, Commission Regulation No. 1251/70 of 29 April 2004 and Directive No. 2004/38 of 29 April 2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council shall be subjected to approximation.

For regulation of the legal status of workers with foreign citizenship, rights of employees and their family members to remain in the country after having been employed, the draft RoA law on foreign nationals shall be amended and a draft Government Decree on the involvement and use of foreign labour force in the territory of Armenia shall be elaborated.

Y2007

To ensure the free movement of persons practicing specific professions, the Armenian legislation shall be approximated with the Council Directive No. 86/653 of 16 December 1986⁶.

For legal regulation of the activities of commercial agents, the Civil Code of Armenia shall be amended, as well as a draft law on self-employed commercial agents shall be elaborated.

Given the necessity of introducing a reliable system for recognition of qualifications in the field of education, the Armenian legislation shall be approximated with the Council Directives No. 89/48 of 21 December 1988, No. 92/51 of 18 June 1998, Directive No. 1999/42 of 7 June 1999 of the European Parliament and of the Council, Council Directives No. 85/432 of 16 September 1985 and No. 85/433 of 16 September 1985 and No. 93/16 of 5 April 1993⁷.

For legislative formulation of the common legal basis for the qualifications recognition system, amendments shall be made to the Armenian laws on Education and on Higher and Post- graduate Professional Education.

Taking into account the expedience of individual regulation of separate fields, a draft Government Decree on the recognition of qualifications in the field of pharmacy shall be elaborated.

Based on the above-mentioned rationale, a draft Government Decree on the recognition of qualifications in the field of healthcare shall be elaborated.

The Council Directive 96/71 of 16 December 1996 shall be approximated with the purpose of regulating the issues relating to the posting of workers⁸. A draft Government Decree on posting of workers shall be elaborated in this field.

For ensuring the free movement of persons in terms of practicing special professions, the Armenian legislation shall also be approximated with the Directive 98/5 of 16 February 1998 of the European Parliament and of the Council, Council Directive No. 85/384 of 10 June 1985 as well as the Council Directive No. 78/1026 of 18 December 1978⁹.

A draft Government Decree "On the practice of the profession of lawyer in a country other than that in which the qualification was obtained" shall be elaborated for legal regulation of the mentioned lawyers' professional degree, registration and their activities.

Within the course of this period, the fields of architecture and veterinary medicine shall be subjected to special legal regulation in terms of recognition of qualifications. For this purpose, draft Government decrees "On formal recognition of qualifications of architects" and "On recognition of qualifications in the field of veterinary medicine" shall be elaborated.
